# 2022 USDA EXPLANATORY NOTES—OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY

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#### AGENCY-WIDE

#### PURPOSE STATEMENT

The Office of the Secretary is headed by the Secretary of Agriculture and includes the Deputy Secretary, Chief of Staff, Under Secretaries, Assistant Secretaries, the Executive Secretariat, and members of their immediate staffs. The Office of the Secretary serves as the management arm of the Department, administering and overseeing the work of the organization. This involves formulating and providing policy direction for all areas of the Department's responsibilities including research, educational and regulatory activities, nutrition, conservation and farm programs, forestry, and international agriculture. It also involves maintaining relationships with organizations and others in the development of programs and maintaining liaison with the Executive Office of the President and members of Congress on all matters pertaining to Departmental policy.

The Office of the Secretary also oversees special projects that are conducted at the behest of the Congress and the Administration. These projects include short-term studies, investigations, and research on matters affecting agriculture or the agricultural community. Project results are reported to the appropriate Congressional Committees.

The general authority of the Secretary to supervise and control the work of the Department is contained in the Organic Act (7 U.S.C. 2201-2202). The delegation of regulatory functions to the Department employees and authorization of appropriations to carry out these functions are contained in 7 U.S.C. 450c-450g. The authority of the Secretary to streamline and reorganize the Department is contained in the Federal Crop Insurance Reform and Department of Agriculture Reorganization Act of 1994, Public Law 103-354.

The Office of the Secretary consists of the Immediate Office of the Secretary; Office of the Assistant Secretary for Congressional Relations; Office of the Assistant Secretary for Administration; Office of the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights; Office of the Under Secretary for Research, Education, and Economics; Office of Under Secretary for Marketing & Regulatory Programs; Office of Under Secretary for Food Safety; Office of Under Secretary for Rural Development; Office of Under Secretary for Food, Nutrition, & Consumer Services; Office of Under Secretary for Trade and Foreign Agricultural Affairs; Office of Codex Alimentarius; and Office of Under Secretary for Natural Resources & Environment.

As of September 30, 2020, there were 93 permanent full-time employees, all of whom 60 were permanent full-time employees and 33 were other than permanent full-time employees. Of the employees, 91 were located in the headquarters office and two were located in field offices.

The Office of the Secretary did not have any Office of Inspector General or Government Accountability Office evaluation reports during the past year.

#### ACCOUNT 1: SALARIES AND EXPENSES

#### APPROPRIATIONS LANGUAGE

The appropriations language follows (new language underscored; deleted matter enclosed in brackets): Office of the Secretary

For necessary expenses of the Office of the Secretary, [\$46,998,000] \$86,773,000 of which not to exceed [\$5,101,000]\$14,801,000 shall be available for the Immediate Office of the Secretary, of which \$9,098,000 remain available until expended for activities relating to climate change, including coordinating such activities across the Department; not to exceed [\$1,324,000]\$13,429,000 shall be available for the Office of Homeland Security; not to exceed [\$7,002,000] \$13,294,000 shall be available for the Office of Partnerships and Public Engagement; [of which \$1,500,000 shall be for 7 U.S.C. 2279(c)(5)]; not to exceed \$2,860,000 shall be available for the Office of Tribal Relations; not to exceed [\$22,321,000]\$27,400,000 shall be available for the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Administration, of which [\$21,440,000]\$26,001,000 shall be available for Departmental Administration to provide for necessary expenses for management support services to offices of the Department and for general administration, security, repairs and alterations, and other miscellaneous supplies and expenses not otherwise provided for and necessary for the practical and efficient work of the Department; Provided, That funds made available by this Act to an agency in the Administration mission area for salaries and expenses are available to fund up to one administrative support staff for the Office; not to exceed [\$3,908,000]\$4,480,000 shall be available for the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Congressional Relations and Intergovernmental Affairs to carry out the programs funded by this Act, including programs involving intergovernmental affairs and liaison within the executive branch; and not to exceed [\$7,342,000]\$10,509,000 shall be available for the Office of Communications: *Provided further*, That the Secretary of Agriculture is authorized to transfer funds appropriated for any office of the Office of the Secretary to any other office of the Office of the Secretary: Provided further, That no appropriation for any office shall be increased or decreased by more than 5 percent: Provided further, That not to exceed \$22,000 of the amount made available under this paragraph for the immediate Office of the Secretary shall be available for official reception and representation expenses, not otherwise provided for, as determined by the Secretary: Provided further, That the amount made available under this heading for Departmental Administration shall be reimbursed from applicable appropriations in this Act for travel expenses incident to the holding of hearings as required by U.S.C. 551-558: Provided further, That funds made available under this heading for the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Congressional Relations and Intergovernmental Affairs may be transferred to agencies of the Department of Agriculture funded by this Act to maintain personnel at the agency level [Provided further, That no funds made available under this heading for the Office of Assistant Secretary for Congressional Relations may be obligated after 30 days from the date of enactment of this Act, unless the Secretary has notified the Committees on Appropriations of both Houses and Congress on the allocation of these funds by USDA agency: Provided further, That during any 30 day notification period referenced in section 716 of this Act, the Secretary of Agriculture shall take no action to begin implementation of the action that is subject to section 716 of this Act or make any public announcement of such action in any form.]

#### Office of the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights

For necessary expenses of the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights, [\$908,000] \$1,426,000: Provided, That funds made available by this Act to an agency in the Civil Rights mission area for salaries and expenses are available to fund up to one administrative support staff for the Office.

#### Office of the Under Secretary for Research, Education and Economics

For necessary expenses of the Office of the Under Secretary for Research, Education and Economics, [\$809,000] \$6,327,000: Provided, That funds made available by this Act to an agency in the Research, Education, and Economics mission area for salaries and expenses are available to fund up to one administrative support staff for the Office: Provided further, of which the amounts made available under this heading \$5,000,000, shall be made available for the Office of the Chief Scientist.

#### Office of the Under Secretary for Marketing and Regulatory Programs

For necessary expenses of the Office of the Under Secretary for Marketing and Regulatory Programs, [\$809,000] \$1,327,000: Provided, That funds made available by this Act to an agency in the Marketing and Regulatory Programs mission area for salaries and expenses are available to fund up to one administrative support staff for the Office.

#### Office of the Under Secretary for Food Safety

For necessary expenses of the Office of the Under Secretary for Food Safety, [\$809,000] \$1,327,000: Provided, That funds made available by this Act to an agency in the Food Safety mission area for salaries and expenses are be available to fund up to one administrative support staff for the Office.

#### Office of the Under Secretary for Farm Production and Conservation

For necessary expenses of the Under Secretary for Farm Production and Conservation, [\$916,000] <u>\$1,437,000</u>: *Provided*, That funds made available by this Act to an agency in the Farm Production and Conservation mission area for salaries and expenses are available to fund up to one administrative support staff for the Office.

#### Office of the Under Secretary for Rural Development

For necessary expenses of the Office of the Under Secretary for Rural Development, [\$812,000] \$1,330,000: Provided, That funds made available by this Act to an agency in the Rural Development mission area for salaries and expenses are available to fund up to one administrative support staff for the Office.

#### Office of the Under Secretary for Food, Nutrition and Consumer Services

For necessary expenses of the Office of the Under Secretary for Food, Nutrition and Consumer Services, [\$809,000] \$1,327,000: Provided, That funds made available by this Act to an agency in the Food, Nutrition, and Consumer Services mission area for salaries and expenses are available to fund up to one administrative support staff for the Office.

#### Office of the Under Secretary for Trade Foreign and Agriculture Affairs

For necessary expenses of the Under Secretary for Trade Foreign and Agriculture Affairs, [\$887,000] <u>\$1,408,000</u>: Provided, That funds made available by this Act to an agency in the Trade and Foreign Agricultural mission area for salaries and expenses are available to fund up to one administrative support staff for the Office.

#### Office of Codex Alimentarius

For necessary expenses of the Office of Codex Alimentarius, [\$4,805,000] <u>\$4,841,000</u>, including not to exceed \$40,000 for official reception and representation expenses.

#### Office of the Under Secretary for Natural Resources and Environment

For necessary expenses of the Under Secretary for Natural Resources and Environment, [\$875,000] <u>\$1,396,000</u>: *Provided,* That funds made available by this Act to an agency in the Natural Resources and Environment mission area for salaries and expenses are available to fund up to one administrative support staff for the Office.

The first change adds language for the funding of climate change activities.

<u>The second change</u> eliminates language that puts undo restrictions on the Office of Partnerships and Public Engagement.

<u>The third change</u> adds language that moves the Office of Tribal Relations, that was previously funded under the Office of Partnerships and Public Engagement.

The fourth change eliminates language that puts undo restrictions on the Secretary of Agriculture.

The fifth change adds language that provides funding for the Office of the Chief Scientist.

#### <u>JUSTIFICATIONS</u>

Base Funds allow the Office of the Secretary to oversee the general management of the department and provide the principal support to the Secretary and the organization in formulating policy and program leadership for the department's functions.

(1) An increase of \$23,357,000 and an increase of 24 staff years (\$22,329,000 and 84 staff years available in 2021). The funding change is requested for the following items:

A) An increase of \$411,000, which includes \$275,000 for pay inflation and \$136,000 for FERS. This increase will support a 2.7 percent Cost of Living Adjustment for pay increases for civilian employees, and a 1.1 percent increase to cover the expenses for the mandated increase of USDA's contribution to FERS.

This increase will allow the Office of the Secretary (OSEC) and its sub-offices to continue to meet its objective in administering and overseeing programs and policies relating to USDA operations. This critical increase is needed to support and maintain current staffing levels to meet the demands and statutory requirements imposed on OSEC. Elimination of the pay cost increase means the OSEC would not be able to fund 2 FTEs and would need to significantly cut travel, training, and mission support. Approximately 70 percent of OSEC's budget supports personnel compensation and benefits. Failure to receive this increase would prevent OSEC from fully performing its mission, which is necessary to ensure continued policy direction for all areas of the Department.

#### B) An increase of \$6,010,000 for 24 staff years to adequately staff the Office of the Secretary.

To ensure the Immediate Office as well as the Under and Assistant Secretary offices are adequately staffed to achieve the mission activities, USDA is requesting funding for permanent positions to execute critical assignments.

This increase will allow for two Senior Advisors in the Immediate Office and one Deputy and one Senior Advisory in the Under and Assistant Secretary Offices. The staff requested aligns with the Secretary's vision for USDA. Additional funding for these positions will bring the offices up to optimal staffing levels to better serve America's agricultural interest, meet the needs of its customers, meet critical deadlines, and remain in compliance with USDA's Department policies and federal laws and regulations.

#### C) An increase of \$9,098,000 for the Climate Change Corps.

Funds will be used to carry out Administration priorities, USDA plays a central role in quickly building resilience against the impacts of climate change which include adaptation and mitigation options across working lands – agriculture, forestry, and rangelands – while also creating new jobs and opportunities. This work includes encouraging voluntary adoption of climate-smart agricultural and forestry practices that result in carbon reductions and sequestration and developing new and better markets for the products produced through climate-smart farming and forestry practices. Steps are being taken across USDA to improve adaptation and increase resilience to the impacts of climate change, and this includes identifying agency vulnerabilities and submitting an action plan. Investing in climate program implementation and enhancing the capacity for American producers advance innovation and put American technologies in the hands for farmers. Increased strategic investments in the USDA Climate Hubs help expand tools and resources for farmers, ranchers, and forest landowners' awareness of – and engagement in – efforts to combat climate change.

#### D) An increase of \$2,838,000 to include the Office of Tribal Relations.

The Office of Tribal Relations will be realigned with the Office of the Secretary. It had previously been under the Office of Partnerships and Public Engagement and the Department is requesting that \$1 million be appropriated directly to OTR as a result of the realignment. Additionally, the Budget requests that \$1.8 million\_be directly appropriated to help facilitate the realignment of the Intertribal Technical Assistance Network from the Shared Cost Programs. If the appropriated funds are not enacted, the SCP will continue as we have funded them in the past.

The increased funding will help to facilitate the realignment of programs within the Shared Cost Programs to the Office of Tribal Relations appropriation. After analysis conducted by the Department of the Shared Costs Programs, USDA determined that the realignment of resources associated with certain programs to

the servicing organizations would better serve and meet the needs of the Department by improving oversight, transparency, and accountability, in addition to a realization in management efficiencies by reducing workload and administrative expenses.

# E) An increase of \$5,000,000 to include funding for the Office of the Chief Scientist. An increase of \$5,000,000 that will support the Agriculture Advanced Research and Development Authority (AgARDA), as authorized in the FY 2018 Farm Bill, as requested funding provided as part of the Under Secretary for Research, Education, and Economics.

The Agricultural Improvement Act of 2018 establishes AgARDA pilot authority (Sec. 7132; amended Sec. 1473H) to develop technologies, research tools, and products through advanced research on long-term and high-risk challenges for food and agriculture to ensure that the United States maintains its position as leader in global agricultural Research and Development. Through AgARDA, USDA can enable the research necessary for engendering transformative impacts and the development of new industries and partnerships. An agile program management structure will provide for rapid innovation and regular internal assessment of progress toward program goals.
